Apart from nurturing CMS into the world's largest cityschool, Dr Gandhi has attracted global acclaim for promoting peace through education. A few notable honours that Dr Gandhi has received are: the Yash Bharti Award of the Uttar Pradesh Government (2014); the Gusi Peace Prize of the Philippines (2011); the Hope of Humanity Award by the Dalai Lama (2010); Key to the City of Georgetown, USA (2002); honorary doctorates from universities of Argentina, Mongolia, Northern Ireland, Peru, Russia, Turkey and UK.

Dr Gandhi speaks regularly on national TV channels. He has been organizing the International Conference of Chief Justices of the World every year for the past 23 years, inviting the highest-level Judiciary from across the globe, with the objectives of building a global consensus in favour of world unity and world peace.

Alumna of Lucknow University and former psychologist at the UP government's Psychology Bureau, Dr Bharti Gandhi is the co-founder of CMS. An able administrator and leader, she has championed numerous social causes and convened an all-India Anti Dowry Conference and the UP State Prohibition Conference.

She has organised several youth and children's festivals to promote international understanding. She continues to organise a Sunday Satsang (spiritual discourse) every week since the last 22 years at CMS. 

Learning with Fun

About 15% of the CMS student body is below the age of 6.

The school environment is engaging and responsive to the child at each stage of his/her development.

In pre-primary years, CMS aims to develop perceptual, motor, cognitive and socioemotional levels of a child, as the basis for readying him/her for school education, and for life in society.

We create a happy environment for social contact with peers, and we deliberately create opportunities for young children to explore and learn through play, dance, music, drama, art, games and sports.

We promote the development of creativity over memorization. English is taught through Fitzroy phonics, with spectacular results, with 4 and 5 year olds doing early reading. Learners get some time on computers for colouring and drawing.





Creative Arts

To encourage creative arts such as theatre (drama) and dance from an early age, CMS provides opportunities with well-trained and experienced teachers at every campus.

Dance

In energizing dance classes, CMS students are taught various classical dances like Kathak and Bharatnatyam, folk dance, as well as western genres like hip-hop, ballet, and jazz.

Theatre and drama classes boost confidence in students as they learn public speaking skills, as well as creativity as students innovatively think up ways to decorate sets, make costumes, and get into character for role play. Integrating Technology

One important aspect of primary education is pupils' assisted engagement with technology. We develop a secure knowledge of computer technology and also an appreciation of its benefits and responsible use. Our focus when teaching IT is on developing computational thinking.

Our smart classrooms are equipped with interactive white boards/flat panels with the latest relevant software and audio/visual content for effective learning.

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Experiential Learning

The CMS primary curriculum is based on active learning rather than on passive relay of information by a teacher. Experiential learning offers in-depth study, giving the learner a better understanding of the concepts and also a handle on the application of the knowledge in the real world around them.

Through project based learning in classes 4 and 5, and the integration of HOTS (Higher Order Thinking Skills) questions in assessments/tests, CMS seeks to develop in primary age children:

- Critical thinking
- Creativity
- Problem solving skills
- Communication
- Collaboration

Assessment for Learning

Assessments drive the class-room pedagogy of the teacher. In line with the National Education Policy (NEP 2020), CMS in 2022 moved away from conventional patterns of assessment which focused on rote learning, towards testing of skills such as critical thinking, application, analysis and problem solving.

We have engaged a specialized assessment company - Centre for the Science of Student Learning (CSSL) to provide us robust assessments that have both validity and reliability.

Students take the test on OMR sheets, which permits us to provide them with diagnostic and personalized report cards. This enables children to improve in areas identified as weak points.

Academics in 2022-23

- Luvina Ramchandani and Shubh Shukla topped the IGCSE exams with A* in all the subjects they had opted for. Navya Rai, Sara Enayati, Summayya Mahi and Saransh Singh Baghel scored A* and A in all subjects. In all, students scored 47 A*s and 27 As in IGCSE.
- In A levels, Anahita Singh made the school proud with straight A* grades in all four of her chosen subjects. Daksh Kumar Singh, Divyansh Tripathi, Varad Srivastava, Aishwarya Singh, Arunima Shankar, Saumya Upadhyay, YashGola, Yuvraj Yadav, and Aadya Shekhar scored A* and A in all subjects. In all, students scored 15 A*s and 33 As in the A levels.
- In another major achievement, Anahita Singh of CMS Cambridge topped in India in Cambridge International AS Level in Economics Nov 2021 and secured third place in India in Best Across Four in Cambridge International As level In 2021, our Cambridge Section students achieved 18 A*s and 13 A grades in the A Level examinations. 




World Parliament

- Prayer of Unity is rendered, first for the country represented, followed by the prayer worded "May Unity Prevail on Earth."



All Religion Prayer



The All-Religion prayer has been an integral part of CMS events ever since the establishment of the school, in which children recite prayers from all religious scriptures on the same platform, along with the message of unity of religions based on the idea that the source of all religions is ONE God. The generosity of spirit behind the All-Religion prayer has won hearts. In a land riven by communal mistrust, the All-Religion Prayer is nothing short of a revolutionary act — a powerful teacher of the oneness of humankind, irrespective of religious belief. It reinforces children's belief in *Vasudhaiv Kutumbkam*.



Junior Youth Empowerment Programme (JYEP)

The Junior Youth Empowerment Programme (JYEP) is an international programme adapted by CMS for the empowerment of its junior students (class 6-8).

A unique platform to nurture the capacities of junior youth, empowering them to fulfill their potential for initiating individual and social transformation.

The programme trains volunteer students from the senior section (classes 9, 10 and 11) to become 'animators' (facilitators) for the junior youth in their own campus (classes 6, 7 and 8).

The opportunity allows the students to:

- Form group identity
- Address issues concerning them
- Design and execute feasible service projects
- Develop virtues and skills
- Enhance intellectual, social, emotional, artistic and moral capabilities.







The Virtues Project

Moral education has been a core part of the CMS philosophy on education since the very beginning, and CMS has sought to bring the most successful elements of moral education from around the world to its students. In the past two years, CMS has adopted the globally acclaimed Virtues Project, a set of 5 strategies to be utilized in classrooms to ensure the moral development of children: speaking the language of virtues, recognizing teachable moments, honouring the spirit, companioning, and setting clear boundaries. The Virtues Project began in Canada and has found success in over 100 countries, even being endorsed by the Dalai Lama and the United Nations. CMS is the first school in Lucknow to adopt the Virtues Project and has invested in it wholeheartedly, bringing in expert trainers from the United States for ongoing training and support of teachers. An inspiring transformation has been seen at CMS, in which students are being supported to develop their innate virtues such as generosity, determination, and joyfulness. CMS has led groundbreaking work with the Virtues Project which was featured in 'The Times of India'.

Go Green Initiatives

At present, environmental preservation is a critical part of CMS's emphasis on values education, and each CMS campus has an Eco Club and dedicated Environment Coordinator. Students collaborate with top environmental organizations including the Centre for Environment Education, UP NEDA, and the Prithvi Foundation. Students research water, biodiversity, and methods for energy conservation. In addition, they engage in service projects such as tree plantations, organic farming, composting, public awareness campaigns, and cleanliness drives such as the Swachch Bharat Abhiyan.

CMS holds the International Environment Olympiad biannually, bringing together students from all over the world, to explore innovative ideas to protect the environment. Additionally, CMS pupils have won top awards related to energy conservation including the Wipro Earthian Award and the Paryavaran Mitra Puraskar. Arjun Singh of Class VIII and Anwesha Sonker of Class VII of CMS Rajendra Nagar Campus II were awarded in Poster Making Competition 'Paryavaran Mitra' organised by RCE Lucknow to spread awareness among the students about the importance of sparrow for our Eco System.



Western Classical Music

As in previous years, CMS Western music continued touching higher levels step by step. In 2022, for several months, we focused on the in-person exams of the ABRSM examination board, which were conducted in December 2022. The prominent role of the international music exam boards, such as ABRSM, Rock School of Music, Trinity etc is to support the learning process for all the music learners. An accurate, transparent, and authentic assessment gives the parents a clear view of their children's progress. It is an honour to host an international music exam board's examiner who comes to assess our students' musical progress and give precise feedback to the parents.

Last year more than 2000 CMS students took lessons in western classical music and learnt to read sheet music in various campuses. Out of these, 85 students took the ABRSM practical exam (Violin, Piano, Singing), and the results were remarkable with all examinees passing the exam with merit and distinction marks.

He also bagged the 5th rank in XXIX All India G.V. Mavalankar Shooting Championship held in Ahmedabad, Gujarat in 2019.


Soccer in CMS took him to Barcelona

Technology in CMS Education

Device-Based & Adaptive Learning

CMS has started providing devices such as tablets and state-of-the-art computers for learning. 'Adaptive learning, is being trialled in a variety of pilot projects to personalise learning to the needs of individual students by pitching specific learning content to each student according to his or her own level of understanding and pace of learning. At the same time, meaningful data is automatically aggregated for teachers to use to inform their teaching strategies. This is enabled through continuous diagnostic assessment through the eLearning platform, combined with sophisticated algorithms and data analysis through machine learning and artificial intelligence. Some of these pilot projects include tablet-based mathematics adaptive learning software Khan Academy having online content, Tata ClassEdge and other artificially intelligent eLearning platforms.

Interactive White Boards & Flat Panels

CMS has installed more than 1526 interactive white boards across its classrooms a total across CMS - to enhance the classroom teaching process. In addition more than 350 interactive flat panels have recently been purchased in the CMS quest to remain abreast with cutting edge technology, to further optimise children's learning experience and to make technological adoption easier for teachers. Our interactive boards are equipped with Tata ClassEdge content - quality, interactive learning content mapped to the children's curriculum. Our LED screens and sound systems support events for children in our state-ofthe-art auditoria and across CMS campuses.

The Robotics laboratories at CMS Rajajipuram I, Gomti Nagar I and Gomti Nagar II, started with the aid of Bangalore-based tech firm Serena Technologies, to introduce students to Robotics and cutting-edge technologies such as 3D Printing with a very practical approach, relevant to all ages.

Students work with 'Nino' the humanoid robot, which can be programmed in many different ways.

This weekly Satsang has been held continuously without a single break since the year 2000, and draws dedicated and enthusiastic participation from adults and children.



Secondly, students of classes 8 to 11 attend the plenary and parallel sessions of the conference, where they get a four-hour opportunity to hear the speakers, offer their perspectives on the conference themes, and ask the assembled senior world judiciary their searching, complex and sometimes discomfiting questions.

The enormity of the opportunity and the positive impact of such participation is incalculable, even though it is not immediately visible. Since students are intellectually engaged in discussion of contemporary world affairs in the presence of eminent international dignitaries and legal luminaries, they wish that their perspectives are valued, and they become aware of the importance of their concerns in the world, which boosts their self-worth, self-concept and confidence. That the opportunity is priceless is attested by discerning parents and students alike, not least because it makes children's vision world-embracing.


The safety and security of children must be the foremost priority of any school. CMS is pleased to share its detailed, well-enforced policies to ensure all aspects of the safety and security of all children.
